USE OF POMANDER RD for WORLD TRIATHLON SERIES RACECOURSE

April 2018

Dear Resident,

You have an exciting front row seat to the heart-pumping action of the MS Amlin World Triathlon Bermuda, on Saturday April 28th.

Pomander Rd is a part of the Age Group (amateur) racecourse from 7am until 12midday, and as such this road and surrounding roads including The Lane, Harbour Rd, Trimingham Hill and Trimingham Rd, will be legally closed to all motorized traffic.

THE ROAD MUST ALSO BE CLEARED OF ALL PARKED CARS BY 4am (04:00) SAT April 28th.

For those who plan to not use their vehicle before 12 noon Saturday April 28th

If you usually park your car on Pomander Rd, we ask that you remove it from the road by 4:00am on Saturday April 28th or it may be towed from the course to a safer location.

If you cannot park your vehicle in a driveway or yard, your neighbouring Royal Hamilton Amateur Dinghy Club (RHADC) has kindly opened their parking area for area residents (members and non-members).

The General Manager Allen Walker has asked that you please call or email him (awalker@rhadc.bm) or Wendy Augustus (secretary@rhadc.bm) if you plan to use the car park so that they can keep a record of who and how many cars to expect. Residents are asked to remove their cars from the RHADC parking area by 12 noon on Saturday April 28th once the roads are again open to traffic.

For those who must use their vehicle in this area before 12 noon Saturday April 28th

No motorised traffic can drive on the course (other than emergency vehicles) between 4am and 12noon, therefore we suggest you park your car or bike outside of the course the night before and walk to your vehicle when you need to use it.
